Attached is the Mercy Flight EMS June 2018 Response Time Report.

** Please note that the Response Times Report reflects the new Response Time Zones – where the "Driving Times in Minutes Zones" overlay the Fire Districts. In most cases, a Fire District will now have more than one "Response Zone" i.e. Town of Batavia FD 7 Minute Zone; Town of Batavia FD 12 Minute Zone etc. The report will only display a "Response Zone" when there is a call in that zone – example, if your District has a "12-Minute Response Zone", but it is not listed on the report – there were no calls that occurred inside that 12-Minute Zone.

Also attached is a listing of the specific responses with the total of ALS versus BLS resources that responded, as well as the total Emergency and Non-Emergency responses, and the total number of calls that were cancelled enroute. (Note that 911-Emergency NLS means a "No Lights or Siren" response.)

This listing includes additional Mercy Flight EMS units that responded to an incident, as well as additional patients that may have been evaluated at the same incident – by the same Mercy Flight EMS crew.

On June 27, 2018, the United States Supreme Court issued a decision in *Janus v. AFSCME Council* 31 that overturned decades of established law related to a public sector union's right to collect agency fees from non-union members. New York employees and employers alike have had many questions about what has actually changed in the wake of this decision. Governor Cuomo has directed the Department of Labor to issue guidance on the decision to inform employers of their obligations and employees of their rights so they know they remain protected under state law.

The Department of Labor has posted this information on our website (https://www.labor.ny.gov/janus-guidance.shtm) and a copy is attached to this email.

The guidance clarifies that the *Janus* decision did not change or affect many of the rights of employees and obligations of employers. The only change under *Janus* is that public employers may not deduct agency fees from a nonmember's wages, nor may a union otherwise collect agency fees from a nonmember, without the nonmember employee's affirmative consent. All other rights and obligations of public sector employers and employees under state law remain unchanged.

Guidance for Public-Sector Employers and Employees in New York State

New York State has a long and important tradition of supporting the organized labor movement and the fundamental right of workers to organize. Public-sector employees play a crucial role in communities across New York State. Each day they work hard to ensure public safety, protect public health, and to provide other critical services to New York residents.

The Supreme Court of the United States issued a decision in *Janus v. AFSCME Council 31*, 585 U.S. _____, 138 S.Ct. 2448 (2018) on June 27, 2018. The *Janus* decision overturned decades of established law and practice relating to the right of a union to receive the payment of fair share agency fees from public-sector employees who decline union membership. As a result, there has been much confusion and this Guidance is intended to provide clarity to employers and employees. The only change under *Janus* is that public employers may not deduct agency fees from a non-member's wages, nor may a union otherwise collect agency fees from a non-member, without the non-member employee's affirmative consent. All other rights and obligations of public-sector employers and employees under state law remain unchanged. For example, unions have, in the past, presented dues deduction cards, or other similar evidence of union membership such as membership lists, to public employers and those employers previously collected union dues from its employees on that basis. The decision in *Janus* does not require a union to obtain new dues deduction cards or obtain other evidence of union membership or remove a public employer's obligation to collect dues from members of a union. Public employee unions are not required to produce dues authorizations cards for members from whom the employer has previously deducted dues.

Collective Bargaining

- Under New York law, the rights of public-sector employees to collectively bargain are unaffected by the decision in Janus. Employees maintain the right to:
 - organize;
 - form, join, or assist any employee organization for the purpose of bargaining collectively through representatives of their own choosing on questions of wages, hours, and other terms and conditions of employment; and
 - o engage in lawful, concerted activities for the purpose of collective bargaining.
- Employees also continue to have the right to be free from threats, interference or coercive statements when exercising their protected rights to engage in concerted activity.
- Public employers are forbidden from interfering in the formation of a union, discriminating
 against or terminating an employee based on union membership or activity, and refusing to
 bargain in good faith with a union.

Union Dues & Agency Fees

- The Janus decision does not impact any agreements between a union and its members to pay
 union dues, and existing membership cards or other agreements by union members to pay dues
 must be honored. The Janus decision only impacts the mandatory collection of an agency fee by
 individuals who decline union membership.
- Employees who are non-members and paying agency fees may choose to become dues paying union members.
- Employees may pay dues through a payroll deduction.



Member Access & Personal Information

- Under many collective bargaining agreements, and under Civil Service Law § 208, public employers are required to provide in a timely manner, the collective bargaining representative with the names and contact information of any newly hired employees.
- Public employees have the right to keep their personal information protected by their employer.
 An employee's personal information, such as home address, personal email address, home or mobile telephone numbers, and other contact information is protected from disclosure (with limited exceptions).

Employees who believe their rights have been violated should contact their employer or their union.

GENERAL REFERENCES

Uniform construction codes - See Ch. 68.

§ 61-1. Title.

This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Unsafe Buildings Law of the Town of Stafford."

§ 61-2. Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code. 1

The provisions of this chapter shall be in addition to, and in furtherance of, the New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code, including, but not limited to, Sections 107 and 108 of the Property Maintenance Code of New York State.

§ 61-3. Determination of unsafe conditions.

All buildings or structures which have any or all of the following defects shall be deemed "unsafe buildings":

- A. Those whose interior walls or other vertical structural members list, lean or buckle to such an extent that a plumb line passing through the center of gravity falls outside of the middle third of its base.
- B. Those which, exclusive of the foundation, show 33% or more of damage or deterioration of the supporting member or members, or 50% of damage or deterioration of the nonsupporting enclosing or outside walls or covering.

^{1.} Editor's Note: Added at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. 1).

§ 61-5. Public nuisances.

All unsafe buildings within the terms of § 61-3 of this chapter are hereby declared to be public nuisances, and shall be repaired, vacated or demolished as hereinbefore and hereinafter provided.

§ 61-6. Duties of Enforcement Officer.

The Enforcement Officer shall:

- A. Inspect any building, wall or structure about which complaints are filed by any person to the effect that (or where he or she otherwise reasonably suspects that) a building wall or structure is or may be existing in violation of this chapter. The Enforcement Officer may in his or her discretion request any additional inspections by other Town, county or state officials which he or she deems necessary to assist him or her in determining if a violation exists.
- B. Inspect any building, wall or structure reported (as hereinafter provided for) by the Fire Department of this Town or any local, county, or state police agency as possibly existing in violation of the terms of this chapter.
- C. Notify personally or in writing the owner or someone of the owner's executors, legal representatives, agents, lessees or any other person having a vested or contingent interest in the property, by certified mail, addressed to the last known address, if any, of the owner or someone of the owner's executors, legal representatives, agents, lessees or other person having a vested or contingent interest in the same, as shown by the records of the Assessor or in the office of the County Clerk, of any building found by him or her to be an unsafe building within the standards set forth in § 61-3 of this chapter and further as follows:
 - (1) The owner must vacate, or repair or demolish said building in accordance with the terms of the notice and this chapter.
 - (2) The occupant or lessee must vacate said building or may have it repaired in accordance with the notice and remain in possession.
 - (3) Any mortgagee, agent or other persons having an interest in said building may at his, her or its own risk repair, vacate or demolish said building or have such work or act done, provided that any person or entity notified under this subsection to repair, vacate, or demolish any building shall be given such reasonable time, not exceeding 30 days, as may be necessary to do or have done the work or act required by the notice provided for herein.
- D. Set forth in the notice provided for in Subsection C hereof, a description of the building, or structure deemed unsafe, a statement of the particulars which make the building or structure an unsafe building and an order requiring the same to be put in such condition as to comply with the terms of this chapter within such length of time, not exceeding 30 days, as is reasonable.



The Enforcement Officer may institute suit to recover such expenses or may cause such expenses together with a charge of 50% thereof to cover supervision and administration to be charged against the property as a lien. A notice of such lien shall be mailed to or served upon the interested person, as hereinabove set forth, claimed liable to pay the same and a similar copy may be filed in the office of the Town Clerk and upon such filing shall be a lien on the real property to the same extent as Town taxes and shall be included in the property owner's next Town tax bill and enforced in the same manner as other Town taxes.

§ 61-9. Emergency cases.

In cases where it reasonably appears that there is immediate danger to life or safety of any person unless an unsafe building as defined herein is immediately repaired, vacated, or demolished, the Enforcement Officer shall cause the immediate repair, vacation, or demolition of such unsafe building. The costs of such emergency repair, vacation, demolition of such unsafe building shall be collected in the same manner as provided in § 61-8 of this chapter.

§ 61-10. Penalties for offenses.

- A. The owner of any unsafe building who shall fail to comply with any notice or order to repair, vacate, or demolish said building given by the Enforcement Officer of this chapter shall be guilty of an offense and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in an amount not to exceed \$250 for each and every day such failure to comply continues beyond the date fixed for compliance.
- B. The occupant or lessee in possession who fails to comply with any notice to vacate and who fails to repair said building in accordance with any notice given as provided for in this chapter shall be guilty of an offense and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in an amount not to exceed \$250 for each and every day such failure to comply continues beyond the date fixed for compliance.
- C. Any person removing the notice provided for in § 61-6E hereof shall be guilty of an offense and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined in an amount not to exceed \$250.



- E. Place a notice on all unsafe buildings reading as follows: "This building has been found to be an unsafe building by this Enforcement Officer. This notice is to remain on this building until it is repaired, vacated or demolished in accordance with the notice which has been given the owner, or someone of the owner's executors, legal representatives, agents, lessees or any other person having a vested or contingent interest in the property, by certified mail, addressed to the last known address, if any, of the owner or someone of the owner's executors, legal representatives, agents, lessees or other person having vested or contingent interest in the same, as shown by the records of the Assessor or in the office of the County Clerk, of any building found by me to be an unsafe building within the standards set forth in Chapter 61, Buildings, Unsafe, § 61-3, of the Code of the Town of Stafford. It is unlawful to remove this notice until such notice is complied with."
- F. File a copy of the notice described in Subsection C above in the office of the County Clerk, which notice shall be filed by such Clerk in the same manner as a notice of pendency pursuant to Article 65 of the Civil Practice Law and Rules, and shall have the same effect as a notice of pendency as therein provided. A notice so filed shall be effective for a period of one year from the date of filing; provided, however, that it may be vacated upon the order of a judge or justice of a court of record or upon the consent of the Town Attorney. The County Clerk shall mark such notice and any record or docket thereof as canceled of record upon the presentation and filing of such consent or a certified copy of such order.

§ 61-7. Inspection of buildings.

- A. The Enforcement Officer shall be authorized, in the performance of his or her duties, to conduct inspections of premises or parts of premises and request such other officials to conduct inspections of premises or parts of premises, at such times and in such manner as the Enforcement Officer may find convenient or necessary, with the consent of the person in possession or occupancy.
- B. If admission is refused or cannot be obtained from the person in possession or occupancy, the Enforcement Officer shall be authorized to obtain a warrant to make an inspection, provided reasonable or probable cause is shown.
- C. In case of an emergency, the Enforcement Officer may, without a warrant, enter any premises or parts of premises to inspect the same, at any time, without the permission of the person in possession or occupancy.

§ 61-8. Performance of work by Town; recovery of costs.

If the owner, occupant, mortgagee, or lessee fails to comply with an order of the Enforcement Officer within 30 days, the Enforcement Officer shall cause such building or structure to be repaired, vacated, or demolished as the facts may warrant, under the standards hereinbefore provided for in § 61-4 of this chapter. The expenses thereby incurred shall be paid by the interested person, as hereinabove set forth, and or by the persons who caused or maintained such nuisance or other matter. The Enforcement Officer shall file as a part of his or her records, an affidavit stating with fairness and accuracy, the items of expense, and that each said item was necessary and the date of execution of actions as authorized by this chapter.

- C. Those which have improperly distributed loads upon the floors or roofs or in which the same are overloaded, or which have insufficient strength to be reasonably safe for the purpose used.
- D. Those which have been damaged by fire, wind or other causes so as to have become dangerous to life, safety, morals or the general health and welfare of the occupants on the people of the Town of Stafford.
- E. Those which have become or are so dilapidated, decayed, unsafe, unsanitary or which so utterly fail to provide the amenities essential to decent living that they are unfit for human habitation, or are likely to cause sickness or disease, so as to work injury to the health, morals, safety or general welfare of those living therein.
- F. Those having light, air and sanitation facilities which are inadequate to protect the health, morals, safety or general welfare of human beings who live or may live therein.
- G. Those having inadequate facilities for egress in case of fire or panic or those having insufficient stairways, elevators, fire escape or other means of escape.
- H. Those which have parts thereof which are so attached that they may fall and injure members of the public or property.
- Those which because of their condition are unsafe, unsanitary or dangerous to the health, morals, safety or general welfare of the people of the Town of Stafford.
- J. Those buildings existing in violation of any provision of the New York State Fire Prevention and Building Code, Chapter 182, Zoning, of the Code of the Town of Stafford and any other applicable law of the Town of Stafford.
- K. Any building or structure which remains vacant and unattended continuously for a period of one year or longer, without adequate safeguards to prevent unauthorized entry.

§ 61-4. Enforcement; standards for repair; vacation or demolition.

This chapter shall be administered and enforced by the Zoning Enforcement Officer (hereinafter the "Enforcement Officer"). The following standards shall be followed in substance by the Enforcement Officer in ordering repair, vacation or demolition:

- A. If the unsafe building can reasonably be repaired so that it will no longer exist in violation of the terms of this chapter, it shall be ordered repaired.
- B. If the unsafe building is in such condition as to make it dangerous to the health, morals, safety or general welfare of its occupants, it shall be ordered to be vacated.
- C. In any case where an unsafe building is so damaged or decayed, or deteriorated from its original value or structure so that it can not be reasonably and economically restored, it shall be demolished, and in all cases where a building can not be reasonably repaired so that it will no longer exist in violation of the terms of this chapter, it shall be demolished. In all cases where an unsafe building is a fire or collapse hazard existing or erected in violation of the terms of this chapter or any other law of the Town of Stafford or the New York State Fire Prevention and Building Code, it shall be demolished.
