#### Town News ... From the Desk of Town Supervisor Ernie Haywood

The Town of Bergen Water District Bids were opened on April 30<sup>th</sup> and May 5<sup>th</sup>. Low bidders were Morsch Pipeline for Contract A at \$4,470,941 and Fineline Pipeline for Contract B at \$3,788,985. Unfortunately, we are \$1.5 million dollars (approximately 17%) over budget. There are several causes for the increase: COVID-19 impacted the production of pipe and materials; natural disasters in southern states also impacted the production of pipe and materials; COVID-19 delayed agency reviews and approvals of our project; rising fuel prices; and the MCWA required some additional main and main size increases.

We went through a value engineering process with the Town Engineers to see if there were any items that could be eliminated or altered without effecting the integrity of the project. There were no changes that made a measurable difference.

I filed an Application for Federal Assistance and a Cost Overrun Request with USDA Rural Development on May 15 in order to fill the budget shortfall. The Town is hoping to receive additional grant funds (which do not have to be paid back by property owners in the district), but we also expect that some of the additional cost will have to be borne by a low-interest loan. Once a new package is offered from Rural Development, the Town may have to submit the loan portion to the State Comptroller for approval. It is likely that the cost per EDU will increase from the current estimate of \$557.

The Water District project will most likely be delayed by several months. The Town will continue to update property owners as soon as new information becomes available. Thank you for your patience during this very arduous process.

Many of you may know that local governments will be receiving federal stimulus money early this summer. We are still trying to understand the rules attached to the funding but basically, local governments will be allowed to use the funds to replace revenues that have been lost and to invest in certain types of infrastructure projects. We are not allowed to use the federal stimulus to reduce property taxes or to pay debt service.

Local municipalities will receive half of their allotment this summer, the other half one year later. We will keep you informed of what the Town of Bergen's share is and how we will use it according to the federal rules.

As more of us become vaccinated, some COVID-19 restrictions are being eased. If you are still in need of a vaccine, please visit orleans countyny.org/covid-19-vaccination or call 585-815-7168. Vaccines are free and both the two-shot Pfizer and Moderna, and the one-shot Johnson & Johnson are readily available.

As we will celebrate Memorial Day on May 31<sup>st</sup>, let all of us pause and remember the sacrifices made by the men and women who have served or continue to serve our country. Wishing you a safe and enjoyable Summer ahead.

There will not be a Memorial Day Parade but there will be a service at the Hickory Park at 9:30 am.

<u>ANTI-RABIES CLINICS:</u> Dog, Cat and Ferret Vaccinations are free to Genesee County residents. A \$5.00 voluntary donation per dog, cat or ferret, is requested to offset expenses. Non-County residents must pay a mandatory \$5.00 fee for each dog, cat and ferret immunized. Each animal must be accompanied by someone who can control it.

#### From the Desk of County Legislator Christian Yunker

The weather has broken are we are well into 2021. It is evident that our economy and way of life pre-pandemic is starting come back around. Our Covid numbers have stayed low and local commerce and businesses have rebounded. We continue to encourage our residents to get vaccinated as our health department continues to provide excellent coordination and service throughout the Community. We have moved away from the large clinics at GCC to an as needed approach at the Health Department at County Building 2 for those getting vaccinated.

The need for a new County jail is still imminent. The existing facility is in need of extensive repair and the State continues to put pressure on our County to move forward with an up-to-date facility. We have re-engaged with our consultant SMRT to reassess our bed needs for Orleans and Genesee Counties and the impact of bail reform on the system. Orleans County may not be able to commit to something immediately, but we continue to plan the structure of the jail to have the ability to add additional pods as needed in the future. We hope to learn more over the next several months about sizing needs, updated cost and bonding figures. We are concerned about what construction costs have done over the past year. Phase 2 of the County's water infrastructure project continues to progress. As we continue to add users throughout the County, we continue to put more pressure on our needs to increase water capacity. We will be closely monitoring our well capacity for the City Water Plant as we will hit peak usage mid-Summer. We hope we do not need to put any water restrictions in place in the event of drought like conditions.

We continue to monitor the rules and interpretations of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 stimulus package out of Washington DC. A significant need and purpose for a good portion of these funds can be used on our aging bridges, culverts and roads throughout the County. The County is excited fill both the Youth Director and IT Director positions over the past month. As always, feel free to contact us anytime with any questions or concerns you many have.
