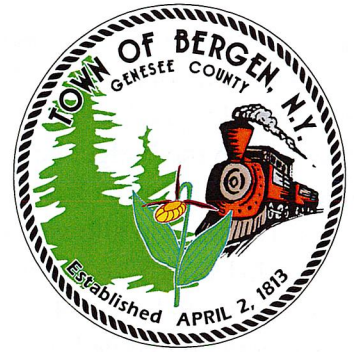

From the Desk of Town Supervisor,
Ernie Haywood....

March, April, & May 2025

Both myself and the entire Town Board continue to look for ways to improve efficiencies and reduce expenditures. Toward the end of the year, we completed an energy audit of Town Buildings and have taken the recommendations under advisement (this audit was funded by a grant received in 2024). As a next step, we have completed a building needs assessment and are exploring options to consolidate Town business offices to one site. Currently, we are exploring the feasibility of adding to the Town Hall space to move the Code Enforcement officer and Assessor office to the Town Hall. We believe this consolidation would not only be more economical, it would also be much more convenient for residents and staff. This option would allow us to move the Historian's office to the library building. We are also looking at the potential of upgrades to the museum.

Currently we are pursuing grant funding to improve our records retention and storage program. I applied for and received funding from Genesee County that will pay for a grant writer to submit a records management grant to New York State. The improved record storage would be for the court, building department, assessor, town clerk, supervisor, and historian records.

Some year end updates: we have transitioned to our new financial software and brought our accounting function in-house; the Town Clerk and Supervisor's annual reports have been filed with the Town Board; and the zoning officer's annual report has been filed with the State. By the time this newsletter is out, the Town's Annual Financial Report to the State will have been filed.

At Robins Brook Park, the Electric Vehicle Charging Station is up and running. Please check the Town website for the fee schedule and information in this issue of the Town's newsletter for more information. A special thanks to Highway Superintendent Joel Pocock and Town Clerk Teresa Robinson for all their work on this project. We are still pursuing the potential of installing a permanent restroom at the park. We have obtained preliminary sketches and cost estimate from an architect and are looking at options. We have applied for a Lowe's grant to purchase a pre-built accessible stainless-steel restroom that our highway department would install on a foundation and for funding to construct bocce courts. Our goal is to provide activities at the park for all ages. Thank you to the Bergen Business & Civic Association for the \$4,000.00 donation to Robins Brook Park to help with this endeavor.

Tax collection season is over and I thought I would use this opportunity to remind taxpayers that the Bergen Town Board was able to keep the budget below the New York State Tax Cap for the first time in many years. The tax cap allowed us to raise taxes by \$22,431 on a \$2.6 million budget. We only increased taxes by \$21,405. Between new growth and an updated roll, our tax base grew by \$23,804,464 or 11.25%. This increase, coupled by the very small tax levy increase, resulted in a tax rate reduction from the 2024 rate of \$2.8003 to \$2.5743 in 2025. This \$.226 rate drop meant the impact of the assessment increase was only about 2.46% for the average property owner which was close to the inflation rate.

I am honored to be a recipient of the 2025 Bergen Business and Civic Association (BBCA) Community Service Award. The award was presented on February 22 at the annual banquet held at the Batavia

Country Club. Congratulations to the other recipients: Tom Tiefel, Amy Phillips, Don Cunningham, and Ed and Ginny Adams. Our community is fortunate to have so many people willing to give back. Thank you to the Bergen Business and Civic Association for all you do to make Bergen a great place to live, work and play.

Finally, I would like to thank Highway Superintendent Joel Pocock and his crew for the excellent job they have done keeping our roads clear during this challenging winter.

From the Desk of County Legislator Christian Yunker.....

We are off and running in 2025 with all of us ready for Spring. It has been a real Winter these past couple of months. Our highway department has been very busy keeping roads clean and looks like we will make it with enough Salt. Our long time head of the Department of Public Works Tim Hens is retiring after 35 years of service to the County this Summer. He is being replaced by home grown talent Laura Wadhams. Laura has been the Assistant County Engineer for many years and was in charge of all the Departments federal road, bridge and airport projects. She was also the County lead for the construction of the new County Jail.

There is a County wide Fire Service Committee that has been regularly meeting. There has been excellent feedback from these meetings with a lot of positive momentum. There is legitimate effort to improve efficiencies and improve communication between departments as locally and nationwide we continue to decline in volunteer numbers. You will continue to hear

more about this. Broadband construction continues to all remaining address points throughout the County.

We are looking to wrap up phase 2 of the water infrastructure project this Summer with the remaining pumps stations getting their final punch list items checked off. We have changed engineers to Arcadis. These are national experts in the field of water infrastructure. They have incredible expertise as they work through the basis of design throughout the Spring and Summer months. There has been a lot of activity in the STAMP site in Alabama as Edwards Vacuum (a leading developer and manufacturer of sophisticated vacuum pumps to support the semi-conductor industry) continues to progress very well with construction of the \$350 million facility that's expected to create 600 jobs. This is supposed to come online in 2026. Feel free to reach out anytime.

With winter hopefully behind us, Spring clean up and road work begins! Brush pick up will begin (weather permitting) on May 12. We will make one trip down each road throughout the town. Please have your brush out to the road prior to the start day.

SHARE THE ROAD, SAVE A LIFE

Tips for Motorists

Cars kill and injure people

- **LOOK** out for pedestrians and bicycles everywhere, at all times, especially on rural roads, where typically there are no sidewalks.
- **SLOW DOWN** around people on the street, in school zones, and in neighborhoods where children are present.
- **SPEED KILLS.** Driving slower than the speed limit is the right thing for safety. Even slowing down by 10 mph can reduce the chances of injury or death by a factor of four or more.

Tips for Pedestrians

Walk Where it is Safe

- Use sidewalks if they are provided.
- If a sidewalk is not available, walk **AGAINST** traffic. This allows you to make eye contact with drivers.

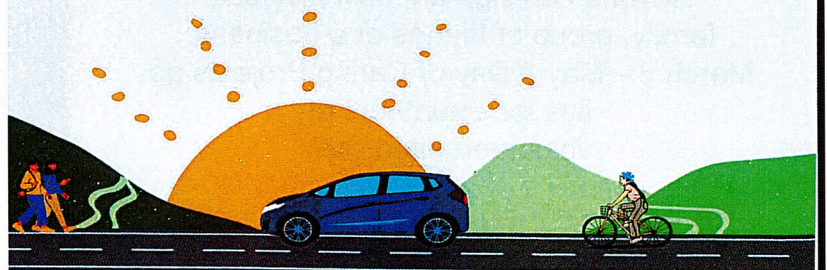
Crossing

- Always use a crosswalk if provided.
- If a crosswalk isn't available, use a location with as few obstructions as possible. Remember, cars have the right-of-way if there is no crosswalk!

Tips for Bicyclists

Bicyclists should always maintain a safe distance between traffic and curbs, while holding a predictable line.

- Always ride on the **RIGHT SIDE** of the road. Riding on the left is dangerous and against NYS law.
- Bicyclists **MUST** follow the same traffic laws as drivers of motor vehicles.

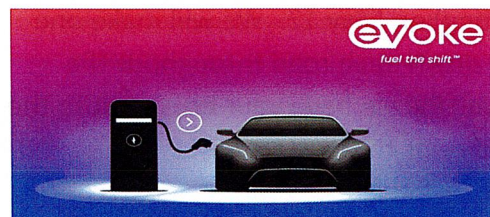

Bergen Volunteer Fire Department Reflects on 2024 and Looks Ahead to 2025

The Bergen Volunteer Fire Department (BVFD) had a busy 2024, responding to a total of 450 emergency calls. These included fire and EMS (emergency medical service) incidents, as well as mutual aid calls to assist neighboring departments. With 58 active members, the department continues its commitment to serving the community.

Explorer Program Offers Hands-On Training for Local Youth

BVFD continues to support its Explorer Program, designed for youth who have completed 8th grade and are at least 15 years old. This initiative provides hands-on experience in firefighting and emergency medical services, including training, ride-alongs, and community outreach.

Participants gain skills in fire safety, emergency response, and equipment operation, preparing them for a potential career in public service or a future role as a volunteer firefighter.

Explorers train 2-3 times per month and have the opportunity to work alongside department members during Monday night training sessions. Later this month, they will be visiting a career fire department in Rochester to further their learning.

Training and Community Safety Initiatives

BVFD prioritizes ongoing training to ensure members are prepared for any emergency. On Monday, February 24, fire and EMS toured the Byron-Bergen School District's facilities to familiarize themselves with building layouts, potential hazards, and emergency access points. These facility tours are conducted regularly throughout the year to enhance response efficiency and community safety, not just at the school, but at other large facilities within our district.

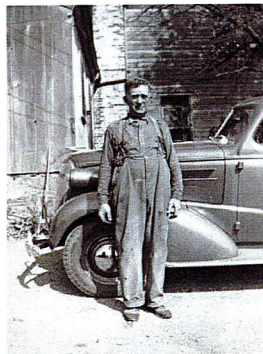
Looking ahead, the department is rolling out a new initiative this spring, offering at least one smoke detector per household to Bergen residents. More details on this program will be announced soon.

The Bergen Volunteer Fire Department remains dedicated to protecting and serving the community through emergency response, training, and public safety initiatives.

From the Desk of Town Historian, Tom Tiefel....

THE SWEET SMELL OF LATE WINTER

As winter draws to a close, the old time tradition of making maple syrup begins in the Northeast part of the country. A practice that goes as far back as the Iroquois. The sweet aroma of maple syrup would fill the air in many a "sugar bush" during the process of "sugaring off" in nearly every community. Bergen was no exception, and in this article we'll talk about the man who was the best syrup maker in town, Calvin Dean.



Calvin Dean was born on the North Bergen, NY family farm on June 15, 1874. In 1898, 24 year old Calvin decided to try his hand at making maple syrup. He had a small sugar bush on the farm and likely learned the craft from the Reed family relations on his mother's side. Calvin started out with a simple outdoor field-stone evaporator, and within 10 years time, he built a sugar shack and graduated to a 4 pan wood fired evaporator. It was said he made some of the finest syrup around, and many a schoolchildren would trek deep into the North Bergen forest just to get the chance to dip their finger in the sticky sweet goodness. One of those schoolchildren was Richard "Dick" Sands. He recalls his experience at the Dean Sugar-shack in this autobiographical papers saying, "Calvin Dean, a long time resident of our community had a sugarbush and sap house. Our group from the Little Red Schoolhouse was always welcome and each one of us were allowed to dip our fingers into the semi-finished product and sample the maple flavored substance. I'm sure our fingers were cleaner for having come through this annual ritual. Anyway, it sure tasted

good and those occasions were among the most memorable of my early years."

Over the years, his operation grew, and by the 1930's its estimated that during its peak operations, Calvin processed over 2000 gallons of sap producing 4-5 gallons of syrup per run. It's said that operations ceased in 1953 just a few years before Calvin's death.

Over time, no one is really sure what happened to the sugar house. Some locals remember seeing it in the 1970's in a dilapidated state. Not a trace of the building remained except for a section of the fieldstone and cement evaporator foundation, evaporator fragments, and the rock pile from Calvin clearing the original build site. The site was cleared and the sugar shack was restored to its original splendor in 2023. Calvin Dean's maple syrup is once again being produced and many of the original trees are once again being tapped that Calvin did so many years ago. If you would like to see more about Calvin Dean's life as a syrup maker, a micro-exhibit will be on display at the Bergen Town Hall from early March through the end of April.

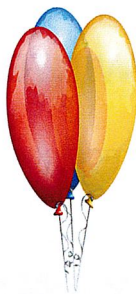
